### **PATRICIA YARBERRY-ALLEN, M.D.**

Dr. Patricia Yarberry-Allen is an Assistant Attending Obstetrician and Gynecologist at NewYork-Presbyterian Weill Cornell Medical Center and an Assistant Professor of Clinical Obstetrics and Gynecology at Weill Cornell Medicine. She is also the Director of the New York Menopause Center and a board-certified Fellow of the American College of Obstetrics and Gynecology.

A graduate of the University of Louisville, Dr. Yarberry-Allen also received her medical degree from the University of Louisville School of Medicine. She completed an internship in General Surgery in 1976, followed by a residency in Obstetrics and Gynecology, and fellowships in Gynecology and Infectious Disease, all at the former New York Hospital/Cornell University Medical College. Dr. Yarberry-Allen is a member of the Faculty Advisory Board and is the Women's Health Director of The Weill Cornell Community Clinic, a student-led initiative aimed at providing high-quality and equitable healthcare to uninsured individuals in New York City who cannot afford care elsewhere.

A spokeswoman on women's health, Dr. Yarberry-Allen is highly regarded as a pioneer who helped shape a new attitude towards menopause. She is a founding member and President of "Women's Voices for Change", a non-profit organization established in 2005 that created and now manages an online magazine ([www.womensvoicesforchange.org](http://www.womensvoicesforchange.org)) for women over 40 years old. It has over 250,000 monthly readers. She was also the inaugural speaker for the Iris Cantor Lecture Series on Women's Health at the American Hospital in Paris, and has been interviewed by *The New York Times*, *USA Today*, regional newspapers, and major television news programs on women's health issues. She is the recipient of several honors and awards, including the 2014 American Medical Women's Association Presidential Award.



### **STEVEN HOCKSTEIN, M.D.**

Dr. Steven Hockstein is an Assistant Attending Obstetrician and Gynecologist at NewYork-Presbyterian Weill Cornell Medical Center and an Assistant Professor of Clinical Obstetrics and Gynecology at Weill Cornell Medicine. He is a board-certified Fellow of the American College of Obstetrics and Gynecology.

*A magna cum laude* graduate of the University of Pennsylvania, Dr. Hockstein received his medical degree from the University of Maryland School of Medicine. His post-doctoral training included a residency in Obstetrics and Gynecology at the Northwestern University School of Medicine's Prentice Women's Hospital. After three years as a Clinical Assistant Attending Physician at the Hackensack University Medical Center's Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology in New Jersey, he joined the faculty of the former Weill Cornell Medical College in 2000, and has been the recipient of multiple teaching awards.

Dr. Hockstein's clinical practice focuses on general obstetric and gynecologic services. The ability to develop a long-term relationship with patients through caring for them throughout their lives, from adolescence through childbearing to menopause and the post-menopausal years, is the aspect of his medical practice that he most enjoys. He feels it is particularly important for patients to feel comfortable with their physicians. He places great emphasis on the emotional well-being of his patients, and is committed to creating a warm, supportive, and comforting environment.
